### **Holocaust History Museum**

Situated on a hillside overlooking Jerusalem's Ein Kerem Valley, the new Holocaust History Museum is the culmination of a 10-year redevelopment project of Yad Vashem, the Holocaust Martyrs' and Heroes' Remembrance Authority. The Holocaust History Museum, the most essential component of Safdie's 800,000-square-foot project, replaces Yad Vashem's existing Historical Museum, and serves as the complex's new core.
