CONFERENCE STRUCTURE

Parallel Sessions

The conference has up to four parallel strands for each session.

Sessions last for 90 minutes. They take the form of:

- **Paper Sessions** allow 15 minutes for each presentation with up to four speakers.
- **Debates, Discussions, Round table, Symposia and Seminar sessions**
Presenters organise their own pattern and timing of presentations lasting for a 45 half-session or a 90 minutes full-session
- **Delegate Sessions** are fully under the control of their creators.
- **Demonstration Sessions** demonstrate an aspect of History Education, including live or videoed demonstration lessons.
- **Workshops** last 45 or 90 minutes. Presenters organise and manage them as they wish.

Presentations can be in the mother tongue + a handout of the main points in English.

Dialogue & Discussion: the programme will build in time for extended discussion of presentations where possible.
